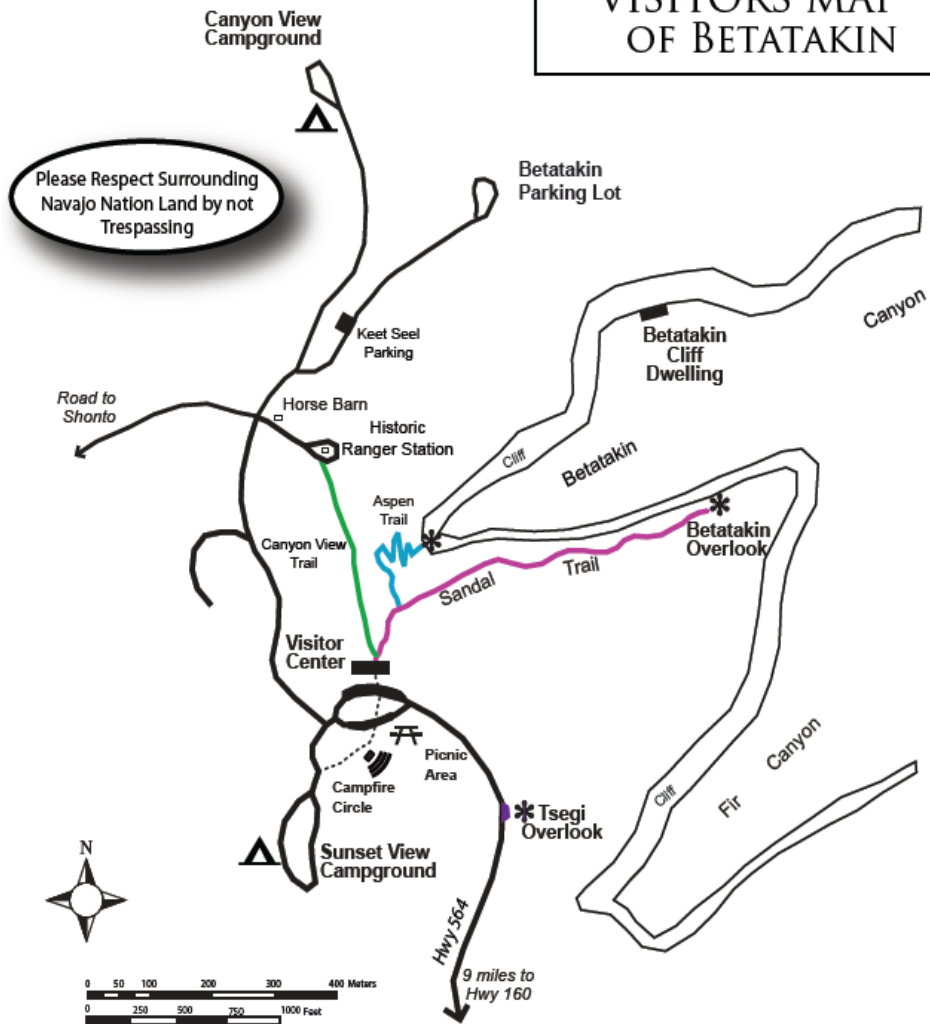




VISITORS MAP
OF BETATAKIN



- * **Sandal Trail:** Most Popular Trail in Park. Easy paved path providing cross-canyon views into Betatakin Ruin. *Distance one way: 0.62 mile.*
- * **Canyon View Trail:** Easy walk offering panoramic vistas of Tsegi Canyon System. Trail ends at the historic Ranger Station. *Round-trip 0.41 mile.*
- * **Aspen Trail:** Strenuous hike providing overview of natural resources, including spectacular relict forest in Betatakin Canyon. *Distance one way: 0.32 mile.*
- * **Tsegi Overlook:** Short, easy walk to overlook from entrance road. Waypoint exhibit highlights the geology of the region. No cliff dwellings are viewable from this overlook. *Distance 0.1 mile south of the Visitors Center.*

Please Note: Visitors are not allowed to venture off trails. Only guided tours of Betatakin Ruin, accompanied by a Park Ranger are permissible. Archaeological artifacts and ruins are precious and irreplaceable. Do not gather, destroy, alter, or otherwise deface archaeological resources or risk prosecution for violation of the Archaeological Resource Protection Act of 1979.

Visiting our monument safely during regular business hours and after hours. The following list of rules is to help make your visit safe and enjoyable.

1. Stay on designated trails to protect biological soil crust (Cryptobiotic soil Crust).
2. Do not shout, whistle, or make loud noises at the overlook.
3. Do not throw objects or rocks off the cliff into the canyon.
4. Do not touch the guardrails during thunderstorm.
5. Do not inscribe symbols, words, and names into the Sandstone.
6. Do not feed wildlife, pick flowers, and plants within the park boundaries.
7. Trails are open as long as there is daylight.
8. Skateboards, wheelies, and bicycles are not allowed on the trail.
9. Bring water and a hat for all outdoors activities.
10. No alcohol or drugs.
11. Keep pets on a leash or confined.
12. Please do not litter. Carry out all trash, this includes cigarette butts.
13. Firearms and weapons are not allowed in all Federal Buildings.
14. Always remember you are surrounded by cultural treasure which we are trying to preserve and protect.
